

C.A.T.S Annual Report 2018

On behalf of Community Assessment & Treatment Services, Inc. (CATS), we are pleased to present our 2018 Annual Report. After 29 years of serving our Community, we remain steadfast in our mission to provide high quality, cost effective, holistic treatment for men and women who suffer from substance use disorders. Through the hard work and dedication of our Board of Directors, staff, donors and community partners, FY 2018 was a very successful year. More than 1,600 men and women took advantage of our evidence-based treatment programming and began their journey towards recovery with us. Proudly, we continue as the premier provider of substance abuse and mental health treatment in Cuyahoga County.

While 2018 was an exciting year, we are looking forward to all that 2019 has in store for us. With that in mind, CATS current 3-year Strategic Plan has kept us focused and working on our goals as the final year of the plan begins. As a part of this plan, CATS underwent a Rebranding Project, contributing to the growth of our organization and the development of a new logo. We also remain persistent in our efforts to strengthen our infrastructure and diversify our funding. In addition, our mission driven, client-focused programming was expanded and continues to provide our clients with the best practices in substance use disorder and mental health treatment.

Since opening our stand-alone outpatient treatment center at 5162 Broadway Ave., the need for these services has grown steadily. Because of this, a second building located at 8245 Broadway Avenue, was renovated and now hosts additional outpatient treatment for men. Over the past 2 years, our staff parking lot (the Brunner Lot) began to deteriorate and sink. The damage became so extensive in FY 2018 that it required extensive repairs including excavation, back filling and resurfacing of nearly ³/₄ of the lot. With the help of a Capital Improvement Grant from The Cleveland Foundation, the Brunner parking lot project was completed and our new outpatient building (located on this parking lot) is now open and operating.

In an attempt to further combat the Opiate Epidemic, CATS celebrated the opening of a new Residential Treatment Center in Medina County and our partnership with Summa Health. Located at Wadsworth-Rittman Medical Center, this is Medina County's first residential drug and alcohol treatment facility. The 16-bed men's inpatient facility offers individual counseling, group counseling, assessments, case management and drug testing. In addition to treatment, CATS will offer ancillary services such as trauma recovery, workforce readiness, financial literacy, recreation, community outreach, and holistic healing through music and the arts.

Collaborations with the Cuyahoga County medical community and organizations like Care Alliance, Salvation Army Harbor Light, University Hospitals, local police departments and other treatment facilities remain strong. CATS also operates successful programming in multiple prisons in Northeast Ohio, to help men and women assimilate back into the community as they prepare for release from incarceration.

From our humble beginnings in 1990 to our rapid expansion into Medina County in 2018, CATS has maintained an unwavering commitment to end the devastating cycle of addiction, mental illness, poverty and incarceration. Every day our devoted staff, Board of Directors and supporters help us reach our full potential and continue to rebuild lives and reunify families.

1,665 unique clients served agency wide, 1,144 males and 521 females.


63% of residential males and 70% of residential females completed all recommended levels of treatment programming successfully.
